## SELF (Social Emotional Literacy and Functionality)

- 4 year comprehensive SEL program
  - Focuses on supporting your student in building relationships with a trusted adult and other students in their cohort
  - Focuses on the development of the core SEL competencies - social awareness, self-management, self-efficacy, relational skills, and responsible decision making
- Students are placed in a cohort of 26 students and with a SELF mentor, starting at Freshman orientation
- Meet weekly on Thursdays during a specially designated Wellness FLEX time
- Draws from the nationally renowned School-Connect curriculum
